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MS. KUCK: Okay, I'm intensely curious. What

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1 is that? Is that oxygen or something?

2 THE REPORTER: It's a microphone surrounded
3 by sound baffling.

4 MS. KUCK: Okay, okay. Objects like that I
5 see increasingly as I'm a nurse and I'm a chemist
6 and I'm a mother. And as a nurse I see the good
7 and the bad from nuclear -- I mean, the CAT scan,
8 all the new technology -- it's wonderful. We're
9 finding more and more cancers. We're finding more
10 and more cancers that we are causing. I think
11 we're becoming more and more convinced that we are
12 causing cancers. And it just doesn't seem real
13 logical to cause the cancers. I mean, I just --
14 We're having lots of energy problems, I know, but
15 nuclear energy is not a solution. It's part of
16 the problem. It's just -- we have to start
17 thinking in other ways. We were discussing on the
18 way here about solar power. And I know a lot of
19 it is expensive; but, I mean, at the rate we're
20 going, we're not going to have a world to worry
21 about, anyway. | So it may be a moot point. As I
22 learn more and more about -- in this little
23 picture, which -- it really shocked me. I'm sure
24 you all have seen it. It just totally blows my
25 mind and it really frightens me. And I'm afraid

2 that my little boy might not have a world to grow
up in. Thank you.

3 MR. LAWSON: Excuse me. Before the next
4 speaker, would you like to submit that picture as
5 an exhibit because it's been referred to in your
6 testimony but we don't have a copy of it?

7 MS. KUCK: Sure.
