

11 MR WHITE: Yes. My name is Randall White,
12 from Atlanta. And I appreciate your giving us
13 this opportunity to come, and I wish that all 50
14 million people who live close to these routes
15 could come, but I think I probably represent a
16 significant number of them. I'm a physician, so,
17 of course, I am concerned about the potential
18 health effects of this proposal. But I'm also a
19 citizen, and I'm concerned about the safety of my
20 community, which has a major rail line through it.
21 Atlanta, in fact, has many potential routes for
22 shipment of the radioactive waste through it.

23 The potential for accident has been discussed
24 1... and is well acknowledged, but [I think that the
25 cumulative small doses need also to be

1 1 cont. acknowledged. That is of considerable concern to
2 me, especially since I actually live fairly close
3 to the track. Overall, I believe that this plan
4 represents an unacceptable risk to our health and
5 safety. Finally, just the anxiety of knowing that
6 for the rest of my life and many of the people,
7 this hazard would be ever present is in itself a
8 burden, an unacceptable one to me and my community
9 and to other people who would be living with this
10 knowledge. So I urge the DOE to abandon this
11 plan.] Thank you.
