6 I think you're trying to cram stuff down our throats that you
7 could do a lot better job and I think you need to go back and
8 figure out a better method, and I don't think it should be on
9 our -- our roadways that we drive and I don't think it should
10 be on the railways that we use for our supplies from east to
11 west.

12 So I don't know if I'm against it, but I'm -- I'm
13 not -- I'm not very -- I don't feel very good about what I
14 hear. I think we need to do more study and work at it more.
