Good afternoon,

1 I understand that until we rid ourselves of our dependence on nuclear energy that nuclear waste will be a growing issue. After that time it will be a continuing concern for generations of Americans. Storing these waste products as safely as possible is enormously important, and the site chosen must be as close to ideal as possible. The Yucca Mountain site in Nevada is a terribly dangerous site, because it is prone to seismic activity and sits above underground streams. Even earthquake activity that didn't destroy the mountain and directly expose Americans to nuclear waste might damage the buried containers, which might then rupture and spill nuclear waste into the groundwater system.

I urge you to consider an alternate site not prone to seismic activity.
