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19           GERALD KANE: This morning something  
20 special was said on separate government which we really  
21 are and the gentleman was kind of expressing that and we  
22 all believed that that's how we should be treated, but  
23 we're rarely treated that way. No fault of the DOE of  
24 course. But transportation is one of the problems that  
25 we all are talking about here. Nuclear waste is going

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1 to be moved down our highways. There's always --  
2 there's always that room for accidents. Bishop is on  
3 395. Supposing the other highways were closed and they  
4 had to use 395? Well, coming down a hill there's a six  
5 percent grade and a lot of things can happen. And it  
6 would sure happen to probably devastate that valley.

7           Another concern is the water. It's going  
8 to be -- nuclear waste is going to be stored in Yucca  
9 Mountain probably. What happens if there's leakage?  
10 Water doesn't stand still. It moves. And it can move  
11 in all directions. So that's a big problem. How safe  
12 is the storage going to be? Who knows? It will take  
13 thousands of years maybe. Who knows? Is that a guess?  
14 We're talking about the safety of the people, not only

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15 our people, but all the people. So there's a lot to be

16 done yet to what should we do with this nuclear waste?
